

Eagle awards for UCF College of Medicine

Fred Denegri won two (2) Eagle Awards for the flooring work at the University of Central Florida's College of Medicine, one for over \$1 million Division 9 and one for the under \$1 million Division 10. The new building is a 170,000 square foot state of the art teaching facility located at Lake Nona, offering medical students the very latest in lab and classroom technology. The \$65 million building was delivered on time and on budget.

"As the academic center of the emerging 'medical city' at Lake Nona, we had a unique opportunity and responsibility to create a building and a campus that reflects our role as Central Florida's Medical School," said Dr. Deborah German, UCF vice president for medical affairs and dean of the College of Medicine.

FBI's Division 9 Scope of Work

First Floor:

The first floor consisted of 16,000sf of porcelain tile and carpet. The main stairs are precast terrazzo with matching 30" precast base at all columns. In addition 30" granite base was installed in corridors. The main lobby of the first floor corridor has a granite compass point medallion as the focal point which was water jet cut off site and custom installed in many pieces on a mud setting..

Auditoriums:

The first floor also has three teaching auditoriums which consists of a custom installed carpeting.

Second thru Fourth Floors:

The remaining floors consist of carpet, porcelain tile, granite base, VCT and a rubber athletic floor in the workout gym.

Coordination and Project Management:

A full time project manager as well as a full time foreman was assigned to this project due to the various scopes of work that Florida Business Interiors was contracted for. Florida Business Interiors worked closely with Balfourbeatty and the owner to provide recommendations and solutions to various situations that arose during construction. With the working partnership of all we were able to overcome many obstacles and complete the project on time.

FBI's Division 10 Scope of Work:

First Floor:

The first floor consisted of custom installed mail boxes, walk off mats, 22'0" motorized projection screens and a custom blackout screen with the UCF Pegasus logo.

Auditoriums:

The first floor also has three teaching auditoriums which consist of custom fixed seating with cherry wood finish to match the wood walls.

Second thru Fourth Floors:

Florida Business interiors scope on the remaining floors consisted of custom wood lockers located in the main corridors, toilet partitions, toilet accessories, cubical curtains, fire extinguishers/cabinets, marker boards, corner guards, crash rails and projection screens.
